Call for Papers

The Young Researchers' Conference (NWT) of the Working Group of Institutes for Co-operative Studies (AGI) offers young researchers of the cooperative system a platform to network, share their knowledge and to receive feedback on their own work.

During this interdisciplinary conference, scientific contributions dealing with cooperative topics will be presented and discussed. (To honour the anniversary of the 200th birthday of Friedrich Wilhelm Raiffeisen, contributions surrounding the idea and the person of F.W. Raiffeisen are also welcome.)

Contributions can be presented and discussed in the following ways:

- Presentation and discussion in parallel sessions (approx. 20 minutes)
- Poster presentation within the conference surroundings (approx. 5 minutes)

Conference languages are German and English. Please send us an abstract of your contribution (maximum 300 words) by **15.01.2018**, with the corresponding form to the following address: ricc@wu.ac.at.

At the XXIII NWT, the AGI will also present the best research paper with the Best Paper Award, which will be sponsored by the DZ BANK Foundation with 500 Euros.

There is the opportunity to submit research papers to the "Zeitschrift für das gesamte Genossenschaftswesen" (<http://www.zfgg.de/>).

In addition, an anthology will be published, in which contributions submitted for the anthology will be published, following assessment by the editors.

The conference participation fee is 75 Euro. This amount covers two lunches, one dinner and two coffee breaks. Travel and accommodation arrangements must be made independently. More information about nearby hotels will be provided upon registration for the conference.
